Stephen J. Henley is a Vice President with the global subsea engineering firm Subsea 7, responsible for delivering targeted priorities for the North Sea and Canada region as aligned with the company's mission statement, vision, and values. Reporting to the Board of Directors, Mr. Henley leads the implementation of the company's strategic plan in the most cost effective and time efficient manner while working internally to establish health, safety, environment and security as core values within the workplace. Through highly-productive collaboration with fellow executive members, strong personal leadership, diligent board development and strategic staffing choices, he encouraged an entrepreneurial culture, focused on enhanced products and services for members.

In addition to Mr. Henley's role in guiding the development of Newfoundland and Labrador's resource sector, he has over 30 years of service to not-for-profits in governance, management, development, and in the role of chairperson. These include chair and board positions with Daybreak Parent Child Center, Ocean Learning Partnership, Wonderbolt Productions and the Newfoundland Ocean Industry Association. In addition to attending Memorial University, Mr. Henley holds numerous industry certifications.
